I didn't know Larry socially. I only knew him as a lawyer. I had several cases with him over the years. I always liked it when Larry was on the other side. Not because it would be easy—quite the opposite. When Larry got the case, I knew that I was in for the long haul. But Larry made contentious litigation a little more pleasant. Larry was kind. He made me smile. I genuinely enjoyed his company. I would describe Larry as "jovial."

Let me tell you a quick story. In October, I tried a case against Larry. I'd wager it was his last trial after 40 years in the courtroom. We had years of litigation leading up to trial. One deposition got very heated. The deponent was difficult, and it seemed there was an objection to every other question. On and off the record, Larry and I both said things that we shouldn't have said. Our friendly relationship appeared to be over.

In the days after the deposition, I felt bad. I felt strongly about my legal position, but I regretted being less than kind to Larry. I considered calling him to apologize, but I couldn't take off my lawyer hat. I thought, "I can't apologize before I see the transcript. I can't let Larry think that I am not confident in my position." So, I didn't call Larry.

Sure enough, Larry called me—and he called before we received the transcript. He apologized for what happened at the deposition. And then I apologized too. And with that, our cordial relationship was back on track.

Since that time, I have regretted not calling Larry to apologize. It's a simple gesture, but a very important one. While I was too busy trying to be a lawyer, Larry was busy being a good guy. That's who Larry was. He taught lessons in civility to countless lawyers over his illustrious career. I'm thankful to have been one of his pupils.
